Preamble

Whereas it appears by message from Her Excellency the Right Honourable Michaëlle Jean, Governor General of Canada, and the Estimates accompanying that message, that the sums mentioned below are required to 5 defray certain expenses of the public service of Canada, not otherwise provided for, for the financial year ending March 31, 2007, and for other purposes connected with the public service of Canada;

May it therefore please Your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of 15 Commons of Canada, that:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act No. 1, 2006-2007.

2. From and out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, there may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding in the whole forty-three billion, four20 hundred and ninety-four million, six hundred and fifty-eight thousand, four hundred and thirty dollars and fifty-nine cents towards defraying the several charges and expenses of the public service of Canada from April 1, 2006 to 25 1<sup>er</sup> avril 2006 au 31 mars 2007, et auxquelles il March 31, 2007, not otherwise provided for, and being the aggregate of

(2) The provisions of each item in Schedules 1.1, 1.2, 1.3 and 2 are deemed to have been enacted by Parliament on April 1, 2006.
