#### MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN.

Whereas it appears by message from Her Preamble Excellency the Right Honourable Michaëlle Jean, Governor General of Canada, and the Estimates accompanying that message, that the sums mentioned below are required to defray certain expenses of the federal public administration, not otherwise provided for, for the financial year ending March 31, 2007, and for other purposes connected with the federal public administration;

May it therefore please Your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, that:

**3.** (1) The amount authorized by this Act to be paid or applied in respect of an item may be paid or applied only for the purposes and subject to any terms and conditions specified in the item, and the payment or application of any amount 5 pursuant to the item has such operation and effect as may be stated or described in the item.

(2) The provisions of each item in Schedules 1 Effective date and 2 are deemed to have been enacted by 10 Parliament on April 1, 2006.

An appropriation that is granted by this or any other Act and referred to in Schedule 1 may be charged after the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriation is granted at any time prior to the day on which the Public Accounts for 5that fiscal year are tabled in Parliament, for the purpose of making adjustments in the Accounts of Canada for the fiscal year that do not require payments out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

Adjustments in the Accounts of Canada for appropriations referred to in Schedule 2

6. (1) An appropriation that is granted by this 10 or any other Act and referred to in Schedule 2 may be charged after the end of the fiscal year that is after the fiscal year for which the appropriation is granted at any time prior to the day on which the Public Accounts for that second 15 fiscal year are tabled in Parliament, for the purpose of making adjustments in the Accounts of Canada for that second fiscal year that do not require payments out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund. 20

Order in which the amounts in Schedule 2 must be expended
